Please Bag or Mulch Your Leaves

Did you know raking, sweeping, or blowing grass and leaves into street gutters or drainage ditches is a big no-no? Storm drains and drainage ditches help move water away from properties and divert possible property damage. Wichita Municipal Code 10.04.030 makes it unlawful to rake, sweep, or otherwise move leaves, grass, dirt, paper, debris, or any other material into the streets, gutters, drains, or drainage ditches along the side of any street or alley in the city. This debris will end up in the city's storm water system, eventually clogging the drains that allow storm waters to drain off the city's streets during downpours. Remind those who mow about this city ordinance and that violators can be charged with a misdemeanor. Keep your neighborhood on track so your property or vehicle does not become a statistic. If you see someone that consistently does this, please call storm water compliance at 268-8337.

PrepareforWinterFireSafetyWith the temperatures dropping, it's time to
prepare your home for winter. Get your furnace
inspected. Install carbon monoxide and smoke detectors
on each level of your house and check them monthly. Our
fire department provides free smoke alarms and batteries

The National Fire Prevention Association says heating equipment, like space heaters, is the leading cause of home fire deaths. Portable heaters need to be plugged directly into wall outlets. Extension cords can cause overheating and fires. Test your heater to make sure it has tip over protection. Remember to turn it off when you leave the room.

Test your family's fire evacuation plan by actually setting your smoke detectors off in the middle of the night. See if your kids wake up and can make their way to the exit.

Chisholm Trail History

Jesse Chisholm and Joseph McCoy

Scout-Cherokee trader Jesse Chisholm first made the famous *Chisholm Trail* in 1864 for his wagons. He used the trail to trade with the U.S. Army and Native American tribes (Indians) from his trading post at the present site of the Twin Lakes Shopping Center in Wichita to his southern trading post in Indian Territories. The Wichita Indians used the *Chisholm Trail* when they moved to the mouth of the Little Arkansas and also when they returned in 1868.

Joseph G. McCoy, a cattle buyer from Illinois, was instrumental in extending the *Chisholm Trail* from present day Wichita to Abilene, Kansas, to promote and establish cattle market for thousands of longhorn cattle from Texas. Approximately 35,000 cattle followed the *Chisholm Trail* during the first season to Abilene in 1867. The *Chisholm Trail* in Kansas generally follows a true north route through or near the following communities in Central Kansas: Caldwell, Clearwater, Wichita, Newton, Goessel, Lehigh and Abilene.

The City of Wichita approved in 1871 the issuance of a \$200,000 bond to build a rail branch from the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad to acquire the cattle business. With the completion of this branch in 1872, Wichita became the new terminus for the cattle business on the *Chisholm Trail*. The cattle business thrived in Wichita with the saying *Anything Goes* from 1872 – 1876


