Neighbors, It's true, home fires are more prevalent in winter than in any other season. This is due in part to an increase in cooking and heating fires. Holiday decorations and winter storms that can interrupt electrical service and cause people to turn to alternative heating sources also contribute to the increased risk of fire in winter. Winter fires can be prevented!

A major part of the Wichita Fire Dept. mission is known as Community Risk Reduction CRR for short. One of the many aspects of CRR is the F.L.A.S.H program, short for Fire Loss Awareness for Safer Homes. F.L.A.S.H. Seeks to educate the public about house fires and decrease the occurrence of these fires.
