
Cleanups are a great example of what we can accomplish when we work together. We also learned many neighborhoods are experiencing the same types of problems.

#### Allen Stoker

I moved into Delano in January of 2018 after being homeless in Wichita for a period of approx eight years total. I work with several of the groups that serve the homeless community. I am a board member for TheCoalitionICT.org, a non-profit that serves the homeless and at-risk citizens of our community. I work daily to bring relief to this group by coordinating events and helping to gather donations for free distributions at weekend events.

I am also a liaison for The ICT Street Team which provides free medical care for the underserved every Saturday morning.

I have been involved with the Naftzger park issue since it first came to light when the City of Wichita announced their plans to destroy the park, and stay involved with different groups that are concerned with the City's continued ignoring of the residents desires and their apparent unwillingness to heed the

public's viewpoint and do what they want even with citizen protesting these "advancements".

I look forward to being able to help the residents of the Delano district in any way I can, and to help them better understand and interact with the influx of our street people friends, and to make our part of this city a better place for all to coexist, regardless of socioeconomic status.

#### **Burn Ban lifted**

The April burn ban did not include outdoor cooking on gas and charcoal grills. The rules for fire pits, bonfires, and chimineas are:

Fire pits cannot be larger than three feet in diameter and the flame cannot be higher than two feet

If you are using a portable fire pit, it must have a spark arrester (screen covering the top)

Only burn firewood or limbs, no trash or refuse

In-ground fire pits need to be 25 feet away from combustibles, portable fire pits need 15 feet of space (combustibles include decks, fences, homes, etc.)

#### **McLean Boulevard Traffic Closure**

McLean Boulevard, west of Seneca, will be closed to through traffic for the next month until June. If you need to travel northwest from any Delano street other than Martinson, Exposition, or Dodge, you'll be fine. During the closure, through traffic will be detoured using Meridian, Douglas and Seneca streets. With the increased East-West traffic, crossing 2nd or Douglas at a signaled intersection is highly recommended.

The closure is part of a project to replace 65-yearold valves within the City's water distribution system. In addition, new underground structures will be constructed to allow access to the valves for future operation and maintenance activities. Electronic message signs are posted along McLean Boulevard to provide advance warning of the closure. The \$900,000 project is funded by existing water rate service charges.

# **Development Glossary of Alphabet Soup**

Many news stories and city press releases about neighborhood growth are decorated with an alphabet soup of development related acronyms. Here are definitions for some of the more common ones:

- ADU An Accessory Dwelling Unit is a smaller home typically constructed in the back yard of a single-family dwelling.
- CDC A Community Development Corporation is a not-for-profit organization incorporated to provide programs, offer services and engage in other activities that promote and support community development.
- CID A Community Improvement District is an economic development financing method that funds public or private facilities, improvements and services within a local city or county usually through a sales tax specific to the district.
- CIP The City/County "Community Investment Plan" details priorities for government spending on municipal, fire, police, and library buildings and infrastructure such as streets, bridges, water supply, sewers, parks for the next 20-years.
- DDRC The Delano Design Review Committee was created in 2002 to ensure developments obey the Delano Overlay zoning code.
- DPAC The Delano Plan Advisory Committee was created in 2017 and approved a revised Delano Plan on March 30, 2018.
- PUD A Planned Unit Development is a type of zoning that regulates land use similar to a homeowners association (HOA).

- RLMP The Riverfront Legacy Master Plan is an upcoming "vision" that connects development projects and both banks of the Arkansas River.
- SSMID The Downtown Wichita CDC is funded by a special tax known as a Self-Supported Municipal Improvement District
- STAR Sales Tax and Revenue bonds are repaid by state and local sales tax incremental revenue generated by economic growth within the development district.
- TIF Tax Increment Financing captures the annual incremental growth in property values to repay development costs.
