

Gas Powered Lawn Equipment Rebate Program

The Wichita City Council recently discussed the lawn care rebate program. Since 2022, the city has provided rebates for lawn care items that replace combustion equipment with electric or battery-powered equipment.

This year, up to \$100 in rebates are available per customer, up from \$50 in previous years!







Earth Day - April 22

Education is at the core of the environmental movement. Climate and environmental literacy doesn't just mean teaching school children the importance of recycling or a board room best practices in sustainable development, it also means implementing action. Each reforestation project we do at **EARTHDAY.ORG** includes community engagement and education to guarantee the trees planted will last a multiple human lifetimes and can be a pillar of good that will last generations creating a *lasting* impact for both the environment and the individuals.

Six things you should know when planting a tree.



- 1. Call Before You Dig Several days before planting, call the national 811 hotline to have underground utilities located.
- 2. Handle with Care Always lift tree by the root ball. Keep roots moist until planting.
- 3. Digging a Proper Hole Dig 2 to 5 times wider than the diameter of the root ball with sloping sides to allow for proper root growth.
- 4. Planting Depth The trunk flare should sit slightly above ground level and the topmost roots should be buried 1 to 2 inches.
- 5. Filling the Hole Backfill with native soil unless it's all clay. Tamp in soil gently to fill large air spaces.
- 6. Mulch Allow 1 to 2 inch clearance between the trunk and the mulch. Mulch should be 2 to 3 inches deep.

WICHITA FOUNDATION COMMITS \$1 MILLION TO ACTIVATE NEW RIVERFRONT AMPHITHEATER

The Wichita Foundation has committed \$1 million for Exploration Place's new riverfront amphitheater, scheduled to open in fall 2024. The Wichita Foundation Amphitheater will showcase the nightly Ring of Fire show at Wichita's iconic Keeper of the Plains sculpture. It will also provide a stunning venue for live performances, free family movie nights and other community events. "This will truly be a space to be enjoyed by all, so the Wichita Foundation is the perfect partner for us on this project," said Adam Smith, Exploration Place's president and CEO.

The amphitheater will be a harmonious blend of art, architecture and nature. One of its defining features will be its unparalleled and uninhibited sight-lines across the Arkansas River to the Keeper of the Plains. The 1,500-capacity amphitheater also includes a mixed-use space designed to promote a vibrant, bustling atmosphere along the river, where pedestrians and cyclists can gather safely.

"The amphitheater will foster community spirit and convening, and is destined to enhance the quality of life for Wichitans and visitors from across the country," said Shelly Prichard, Wichita Foundation's president and CEO. "We are thrilled to spur the momentum and impact of this bold space, and know the amphitheater will be a jewel within our city."

Exploration Place opened in April 2000 and welcomed a record 403,543 visitors in 2023. The Wichita Foundation Amphitheater marks the first phase in a \$22 million project to develop Exploration Place's 20-acre riverfront property.




