

President's Letter

I've learned a lot lately by browsing through archives of our neighborhood newsletters. The Delano Neighborhood Association (DNA) was formed on August 19, 1996. Through July of 2013, our neighborhood counted on a small army of around 56 volunteers known as district directors and block captains to distribute our newsletters. At that time, we started experimenting with options for paid delivery via increased advertising due to a shortage of volunteers. During the pandemic, our paid subscribers gradually declined their renewals.

In 2012, we held a meeting about the prospects of a future of "The Delano Bike Path" that we will soon see completed as the "Chisholm Trail Parkway". We were also short on volunteers that year for our neighborhood cleanup. Back then, we were allowed to notify neighbors about the cleanup through our newsletter several weeks in advance. After cleanup publicity unintentionally led to illegal dumping all around Wichita, the City forbid cleanup publicity outside of the cleanup area. Neighbors who attended our last two monthly meetings knew the upcoming cleanup dates and details. Neighbors who retreated into using social media as their only way to connect with their neighbors found themselves in the dark. We had a whopping three volunteers who attempted to walk flyers to around 1,300 homes in a 3/4 square mile area during their free time. Yet, we still heard complaints. To top it all off, we only had four volunteers participate on cleanup morning. Based on the size of our area, the City requires us to have a minimum of 20 volunteers signed up due to all the costs to the City associated with a cleanup. When enough volunteers have contacted me with their address and either phone or email, we will apply for our next neighborhood cleanup.

We live in a great historical neighborhood which is currently experiencing long awaited

and significant changes. There are so many wonderful people helping their neighbors regularly without seeking any credit. If we can't find ways to stay involved, 28 years of hard work will start to deteriorate. I hope you feel free to show community support and pride by joining us for meetings on the third Tuesday of each month, or finding another way to be involved.

We are still in need of District Directors for Districts 1 and 5. See map on page 2 showing the boundaries for each District. What's involved? Please read the job description below to determine if you are a good fit.

"District Directors, Directors live within the district they reside. The Directors are encouraged to get to know the specific needs of their districts and make contact with neighborhood members to learn as much as possible of those needs and specifics. The Director will bring a report of those needs and specifics to the attention of the Executive Board at their next Board Meeting. To enhance the communication process the Director can appoint Block Captains within his/her district. The Block Captains should be relied upon to be the ears and eyes of the Director and should assist in facilitating overall communication within their area. Directors and Block Captains can call for meetings within their area of responsibility to enhance proper communication and the solving of specific issues that can only be remedied at the local level."

It will assist citizens who are currently on parole with education and job opportunities.

Exploration Place Expansion

On June 27, Exploration Place announced their latest development phase to privatize their remaining green space. Destination Playscape will encompass 6.5 acres over ten landscaped playgrounds known as "playscapes".

Playscape park themes will include Aviation Flight Adventure, Water Play Cascades, Agriculture Overlook, Bison Hill Foggy Flint Hills, Prairie Play, Sensory Garden, Slide Hill, Sunflower Meadow, and Treetop Climber. Access to these outdoor areas will now be restricted to Exploration Place members, visitors with paid admission, or with free museum admission partnerships.

Their goal is to increase tourism and attendance 60% to 1 million annual visitors and grow revenues 70%.
