The annual Delano Safe Treat was another huge success this year. Be sure to check out the photos on page 9 to see just a few of our participants.







The January issue of our *Dispatch* debuted a new feature called "*Out and About in Delano*" which will be a page where each month photos of anything in Delano will be shared.



Historic Midtown Walking Tour November 9th & 10th

Hours: Saturday 12-5pm, Sunday 1-5pm

The Midtown Citizen Association is announcing our Historic Walking Tour of the interior and exterior of homes built at the turn of the century in Wichita. Included on the tour will be the Vermilion Rose, Circa 1887. The last time this address was on the tour was the early 1980s, and our homeowner is excited to once again share one of the jewels of Historic Midtown.

Tickets are \$20, children 12 and under are free. Tickets can be purchased at the ticket booth located at 11th and Topeka. Proceeds from the tour support our Historic Midtown non-profit initiatives including preserving historic addresses in Wichita as well as a yearly scholarship for a student residing in Midtown attending WSU.

Parking is at St Paul's United Methodist Church, 1356 N Broadway and also at GraceMed, 1150 N Broadway.

Temporary Riverfront Pathway Closure At Exploration Place

Exploration Place, in coordination with the City of Wichita, would like to inform the community about a temporary closure of the riverfront pathway for construction and maintenance work.

This closure will occur December 2 - 20. See attached map for further details.

During the closure period, a clearly marked detour route will be in place to guide foot and bike traffic safely around the construction zone. Signage will be posted to ensure the safety and convenience of all pathway users.
