







### **Earth Day - April 22**

Each reforestation project we do at **EARTHDAY.ORG** includes community engagement and education to guarantee the trees planted will last a multiple human lifetimes and can be a pillar of good that will last generations creating a *lasting* impact for both the environment and the individuals.

#### Six things you should know when planting a tree.



- 1. Call Before You Dig Several days before planting, call the national 811 hotline to have underground utilities located.
- 2. Handle with Care Always lift tree by the root ball. Keep roots moist until planting.
- 3. Digging a Proper Hole Dig 2 to 5 times wider than the diameter of the root ball with sloping sides to allow for proper root growth.
- 4. Planting Depth The trunk flare should sit slightly above ground level and the topmost roots should be buried 1 to 2 inches.
- 5. Filling the Hole Backfill with native soil unless it's all clay. Tamp in soil gently to fill large air spaces.
- 6. Mulch Allow 1 to 2 inch clearance between the trunk and the mulch. Mulch should be 2 to 3 inches deep.





## Reggie Davidson Named City of Wichita Park and Recreation Director

Interim Park and Recreation Director Reggie Davidson, MSRLS, CPRE has been selected as the next director of Wichita Park and Recreation. The Director of Park and Recreation oversees the management, development, and operations of the Park and Recreation Department, driving initiatives that enhance the quality of life for residents and visitors.

Davidson has served as the interim Park and Recreation director since September 2024. As the Park and Recreation director, Davidson





Davidson first joined the City of Wichita in 2018 when he was hired as the Superintendent of Recreation for Wichita Park and Recreation, managing recreation programming and facility operation, assisting with strategic planning for the department and more. Prior to his time in Wichita, he served as the Recreation Manager for the City of Round Rock, Texas.

"Reggie has strong leadership skills and a passion for service that extends beyond his Park and Recreation duties," City Manager Robert Layton said. "He cares deeply about ensuring that our community is well-positioned to meet the needs of residents and making Wichita a dynamic, engaging place to live."

Davidson holds an M.S. in Recreation and Leisure Services and Management from Texas State University, and a B.S. in Criminal Justice and Corrections from Jackson State University. He is a Certified Park and Recreation Executive.

The Park and Recreation Department consists of four divisions: Operations, Parks, Recreation, and Golf. The department provides award-winning leisure opportunities and enriches Wichita residents and surrounding communities by caring for outdoor spaces such as parks, trails, golf courses, and natural landscapes. Park and Recreation consists of 147 full time employees, a budget of approximately \$29 million and oversees 150 park properties, six pools, 12 splash pads, four golf courses and seven recreation centers.


